

All of this takes resources and capital, which is what we at WCEF are all about.

Established in 1983, WCEF is a non-profit, parent-led organization that operates independently of, but in partnership with, our districts to raise additional funds to offer services, programs, and electives beyond that of a basic state funded education. The Foundation raises funds for eight schools, 5,100 students in TK-12, and countless teachers and staff in Walnut Creek.

Every year our schools rely on 100% participation from our families and the greater community to bridge the almost \$2,550* per student funding gap between what we receive from the state and what it costs to provide a quality education to our children.





MISSION STATEMENT
